About St George's Youth Club

St George's Youth Club has a long history in the area of Hanworth and Feltham of working with young people using a Christian and pastoral approach, with encouragement of the "physical, mental, and spiritual development of young people." We provide youth work evenings, mentoring and mental health support networks, annual residential activity weeks and much more.

The local area has a substantial youth population of 20,000 under 24 years of age. The youth club seeks to address disadvantage where possible, and many young people who attend or use our services experience economic, social, or personal difficult circumstances.

Job Description

Post:	Youth Worker
Location:	Hanworth, Feltham and surrounds (Heathrow area)
Working pattern:	Part-time, 20 hours per week - 0.5FTE (negotiable). Youth work sessions normally run from 6.30-8.30pm. Some weekend working will be necessary, but time off in lieu is given according to our policy.
Responsible to:	Chairman of Trustees and Trustees of St George's (Hanworth) Youth Club
Key relationships:	London Borough of Hounslow; Scout Association; UK Youth; St George's Church, Hanworth; local schools; other youth organisations in the area
Job purpose:	St George's Youth Club is seeking experienced youth worker/s to re-launch the youth club following the recent COVID-19 pandemic restrictions, to build on past successes, and expand youth work provision in accordance with the club's 5-year plan.

Responsibilities:

1. To provide children and youth services as part of St George's Youth Club outreach work.
2. To support outreach work in Hanworth & Feltham and provide activities in partnership with local organisations.
3. To deliver informal education opportunities and mentoring within the identified sessions.
4. To promote and safeguard the welfare of the children and young people.
5. To engage actively in learning and professional development courses provided.

Specific duties:

1. Plan and lead specific activities with young people in a youth centre or a digital settings (in response to COVID-19 restrictions)
2. Design young person-friendly courses, for physical and digital delivery, according to local need and interest.
3. Deliver outreach sessions within the local area.
4. Support youth events across Hanworth and Feltham
5. Work with a focus group of young people to inform project monitoring and evaluation.
6. Support young people through 1:1 or group mentoring.
